


Welcome to Year 8 Summer Reading Recommendations





Very Contemporary Fiction

- When Hitler Stole Pink Rabbit: Judith Kerr heart-warming story of emigration from Nazi Germany.







- Welcome to Nowhere: Elizabeth Laird a boy and his family are caught up in civil war in Syria.

















- Framed and Millions: Frank Cottrell Boyce fun and pacy adventure!
